Mayor Ronnie Bobblett called to order the Bloomfield City Council regular monthly meeting at 6:30 p.m. at the Northeast Nelson Firehouse. Attending were council members Ann Agee, Henry Cobble, Liz Gillis, Johnathan Hagerman, Mark Mays, and Walter Pozgay. Police Chief Mike Cotton was also present. City Attorney Jim Willett and Public Works Superintendent Ben Long were absent.

MINUTES AND FINANCIAL REPORTS: Council members were mailed a copy of last month's meeting minutes whereby the reading was waived. Pozgay made a motion, duly seconded by Agee, to approve the meeting minutes. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.* Pozgay made a motion, duly seconded by Mays, to approve the financial reports as presented. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

ORDINANCE 2009-64, CABLE FRANCHISE: Clerk Jury read the second reading of this franchise ordinance that included the agreement to be executed between the City of Bardstown and the City of Bloomfield. With the addendum to make the cable franchise agreement term 15 years instead of 10 years Gillis made a motion, duly seconded by Agee, to adopt the ordinance. *Motion carried by the following 6-0 roll call vote:* Agee-yes, Cobble-yes, Gillis-yes, Hagerman-yes, Mays-yes, and Pozgay-yes.

CIVIC CENTER RENTAL AGREEMENT: Three rental classifications were established. (1) For a non-profit organization rental Pozgay, duly seconded by Cobble, made motion to charge \$25 per hour. *Motion carried by a vote of 5-1.* (2) For private rental Gillis, duly seconded by Agee, made motion to charge a \$100 deposit in addition to \$75 for the first hour, \$50 for every hour thereafter. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.* (3) For commercial rental Gillis, duly seconded by Agee, made motion to charge a \$100 deposit in addition to \$100 per hour. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.* A rental agreement was modified and rules for use were discussed as Gillis made notes to give to Attorney Willett for the final draft. The mayor informed the Council that the city has three rentals scheduled at the previously tentative rates.

BLOOMFIELD BEAUTIFICATION ORGANIZATION: Now named "C3 Committee" for Citizens for a Cleaner Community they sent a report by liaison Mark Mays. He presented a report from the committee that noted particularly a March 30 public meeting at the Civic Center to discuss a community cleanup project tentatively planned for Saturday, April 18.

LITTER ABATEMENT: Gillis made a motion with Mays second to plan the roadside cleanup on the same Saturday, April 18 as the C3 Committee's cleanup project. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*

NEW BUSINESS

DELINQUENT TAXES: The 2008 unpaid taxes are now considered delinquent and are listed below as "Exhibit A". A 12% penalty has been applied and 12% interest will be charged for every following year and compounded annually until paid.

CONCERNS OF THE COUNCIL

Pozgay spoke about winter storm brush and what to do with it. The mayor said that city property owners that do not have property that borders a state highway are responsible for their own brush from recent storms. They may take storm brush to the old Nelson County quarry on Quarry Lane. He also asked for a new Kentucky Flag at the Veteran's Monument. Gillis suggested asking David Floyd to assist

in getting a new flag. He also announced that soccer starts tomorrow night at the Conley Avenue Park field. He noted that the old newspaper recycling building would soon be moved from the Bloomfield Fertilizer parking lot to the Conley Avenue field. He also said the soccer organizers will forward the proper proof of insurance for the soccer league.

Cobble spoke of trash blowing from the garbage trucks when tipping cans into the trailer.

ADJOURNMENT

Cobble, duly seconded by Pozgay, made a motion at 8:15 p.m. to adjourn. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*
