Mayor Ronnie Bobblett called to order the Bloomfield City Council regular monthly meeting at 6:30 p.m. at the Northeast Nelson Firehouse. Council members present were: Henry Cobble, Liz Gillis, Tina Long, Mark Mays, and Walter Pozgay. Public Works Superintendent Ben Long and City Clerk Jean Jury were also present. Media present were: Kentucky Standard's Lydelle Abbot and radio station WBRT's Fred Hagan. Council member Richard Sweazy and City Attorney Jim Willett were absent.

MINUTES AND FINANCIAL REPORTS: Council members were mailed a copy of last month's regular meeting minutes whereby the reading was waived. T. Long made a motion, duly seconded by Mays, to approve the November 12th meeting minutes. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.* Pozgay made a motion, duly seconded by Cobble, to approve the financial reports as presented. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*

CONCERNS OF THE PUBLIC

Bloomfield Community of Tomorrow (BCT) member Amos Gritton presented the Council with a resolution to consider approving the city's application to become a "Preserve America" community, the White House Initiative developed in cooperation with the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, the U.S. Department of the Interior and the U. S. Department of Commerce.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

RESOLUTION 2007-71; PRESERVE AMERICA APPLICATION: Mays made a motion, duly seconded by Gillis, to approve the city partnering with the Bloomfield Historic Preservation committee Nancy Glisson, Amos Gritton and Liz Gillis to apply for the above-mentioned "Preserve America" designation in order to qualify for future funding for projects that will protect and celebrate Bloomfield's historic heritage. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*
WORK SESSION: November 19th work session was cancelled.

NEW BUSINESS

RESOLUTION 2007-70; BLOOMFIELD DRY CLEANERS RECOGNITION: Motion was made by Mays, duly seconded by Gillis, to acknowledge the years of service exhibited by the Bloomfield Dry Cleaners owners Bob and Becky Lester, Marilyn and Ken Walker and recognize their many contributions to the community while this business closes its doors this year. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*
ZONING REGULATION TEXT AMENDMENTS: The City Clerk distributed copies of new Zoning Regulation Articles 18, 19 and 20 to the City Council. The mayor recommended the Council review the material and consider action at a future meeting.

CONCERNS OF THE COUNCIL

Gillis reported the Goodloe Street sign gone. She reiterated her vision of the city operating a civic or senior center.

Pozgay expressed gratitude to Tina Long for a successful “Light Up Bloomfield” event held December 1. He agreed closing the first block of Fairfield Hill Road was a good idea during this event.

Mays thanked T. Long also. In regard to the City’s cable TV contract with Insight expiring in 2009 he asked the Mayor for a status report.

ADJOURNMENT

Pozgay made a motion at 7:00 p.m. to adjourn. With May’s second *motion carried by unanimous decision*. A holiday reception, prepared by the city clerk, followed in the City Hall’s conference room.
