SPECIAL MEETING

Mayor Rhonda Hagan called to order the December special meeting of the Bloomfield City Council at 6:30 p.m. at the Nelson County Bloomfield Branch Library. She led the *Pledge Allegiance to the Flag*. Council members present were Laura Barnett, Christopher Dudgeon, Janet Graves, Denny Howard and Suzanne Marks. City Attorney Amanda Deaton, Police Chief Scott Dennis, and City Clerk Jean Jury were also present. Council member Ann Martin was absent.

MINUTES AND FINANCIAL REPORTS: Council members picked up the meeting packets at City Hall. The packets included tonight's agenda and the November 13, 2017 regular meeting minutes and financial reports. Reading of the minutes was waived. Howard made a motion, duly seconded by Graves, to approve the regular meeting minutes. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.* Next, Marks made a motion, duly seconded by Dudgeon, to approve the financial reports as presented. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*

BUSINESS

GLISSON RECOGNITION OF SERVICE: Mayor Hagan acknowledged James (Jim) C. Glisson's term as a Bloomfield City Council Member from January 2015 through October 2017. She presented him with a plaque commemorating his service years and appreciation for his contribution to the City of Bloomfield.

RESOLUTION 2017-131, BILL THOMPSON'S MEMORIAL: Attending the meeting was special guest Lil Thompson, wife of Bill Thompson. William Nichols "Bill" Thompson died November 27, 2017. He served on the Bloomfield City Council from 1992 to 2002. Mayor Hagan read a resolution acknowledging Thompson's contribution to his family, church, community and country. The resolution announced that this resolution would be spread upon the permanent official records of the City. To make this memorial official Barnett promptly made a motion, duly seconded by Howard, to adopt the resolution. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*

WASTE MANAGEMENT GARBAGE CONTRACT EXPIRES: With the contract expiring February 28, 2018 the City has 60 days to renew. Mayor Hagan was sent word from WM Public Sector Representative Andy Reynolds that WM is proposing to renew the City's contract at the same \$11.23 per customer rate for the next three or five years. Graves made a motion to renew for the next five years. Duly seconded by Barnett, *motion carried by unanimous decision.*

Howard made motion, duly seconded by Marks, to adjourn at 6:45 p.m. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*
